Despite the financial challenges that we face, my mom and my family would want my brother and I to break the generational curse of not pursuing higher education.

When I declared my major as Environmental Science and Policy, I looked for ways to get involved on campus that revolved around my field or sustainability-oriented opportunities. One of my initial involvements was with ASUCI where I was an intern with the Sustainability Project Commission. I really enjoyed my time there and a lot of what we did revolved around organizing events on campus such as the Zot N Clothes drive, where students can donate their unwanted clothes. After we gather all the clothes, we host a free clothing drive on campus where students can come and pick a couple of items that they can keep. I was also an Outreach Coordinator for the UCI Sustainability Resource Center and was responsible for being the connection between students' goals and the center's resources. I also helped to recruit students for the different internships and opportunities that the center has.

UCI has done an amazing job at supporting me and my career goals. I've met amazing people and had amazing opportunities on campus. When I was applying to scholarships, the Resilient Family Scholarship spoke to me personally and having been selected for it, was a big surprise. I am very grateful for it and it has helped me be able to afford college especially during my last year here at UCI. I grew up in a low income area in Paramount, on the border of Compton. During my teenage years, my family and I were able to move away from there. My academic performance had never been great, and I had little interest in returning to school after graduating high school, partly due to the financial constraints my family faced.

When COVID struck, I was working 4 jobs and I lost all of them. The few available jobs that were hiring required you to have an Associate of Arts degree to be in management. That is when I re-evaluated my educational journey and went back to school. To finance my return to school, I used the money that I saved from working to enroll at Irvine Valley College (IVC). I also met a professor who was very supportive, and he encouraged me to join the Honors program and to apply for different opportunities. The more I tried, the more I succeeded and started to recognize my own potential. I lived my life thinking I was incapable of really achieving anything. Successfully transferring to UCI using the honors to honors was, and still is, one of my greatest achievements.

During my first week at UCI, I made appointments with UROP because I knew I wanted to do my own research. I also sought assistance from my campus wide honors advisor counselor and explored resources provided by the School of Social Ecology. I joined the ACE program where I had a mentor who had weekly meetings and check ins with me. I was selected to join Psi Chi, an international honor society for psychology majors on campus that offered a ton of resources and mentoring. I also read all my emails recognizing that is where all the opportunities are. I applied to everything possible, knowing full well that I would not get everything, but anything was worth a try. I will do everything I can to continue my education.

Receiving the scholarship has helped a lot. It has relieved a lot of stress and gave me room to breathe. The scholarship has helped me with rent, I do not have to work as many hours as I did before, I can focus on school more, and the biggest thing is that it has provided me support through my educational journey. My goal is to go to graduate school to obtain a Ph.D. in Social Psychology and be a university professor. I want to be able to conduct my own research while teaching. I want to help and advocate for students because it changed my life that a professor was there for me.

The University of California, Irvine (UCI) is offering scholarships for UCI students who are music enthusiasts, regardless of their major, thanks to a generous \$100,000 pledge from The Drake Gives, a charitable organization founded in 2021 by Alec Glasser, a commercial developer and restaurateur. "Im very happy and blessed that we are starting this partnership with UCI because the university has so much involvement in the community and Im happy to be part of it" Alec stated. The scholarships aim to support students who plan to incorporate music into their future careers. UROP is your gateway to a world of discovery. They offer a range of opportunities to support your academic and personal growth:

- Research Discovery Program: New to UCI? UROP's Research Discovery Program is designed to prepare first-year freshmen and transfer students academically, professionally, and personally for research opportunities during their academic journey at UCI. The program offers programming and graduate student mentorship.
- Recognition and Funding: UROP provides financial support for faculty-mentored research projects throughout the year, including the summer through their Calls for Proposals.
- Annual Undergraduate Research Symposium: Each May, UCI undergraduate students come together to present their research findings at the Undergraduate Research Symposium. It's a chance to showcase your hard work, learn about research opportunities on campus, and network with fellow students, faculty, and corporate partners.
- Endless Possibilities: Your research or creative activity can be in virtually any field. Whether you're joining faculty in their labs, conducting independent research with a faculty member, or creative activities such as choreographing an original performance, UROP supports your passion. GETTING STARTED

Current students can start research whenever they feel ready and can find a faculty mentor. While many students start after their freshman year, UROP encourages you to explore opportunities as soon as possible so that you have time to do at least 1-2 years of research as an undergraduate student. It is available any time throughout the year and all you need is good academic standing and a UCI faculty mentor guidance. Please note that some programs may have additional requirements that are noted on UROP's website.

In the upcoming academic year, 2023-2024, UROP will host numerous workshops from topics such as "Get Involved in Research" to "How to Prepare to Present at Symposium." During fall quarter, they will also host a Presentation Pitch Challenge to showcase students' research. In mid-May, UROP will host their huge campuswide undergraduate research symposium at the Bren Event Center. Be sure to check their calendar for dates on upcoming events and workshops.
